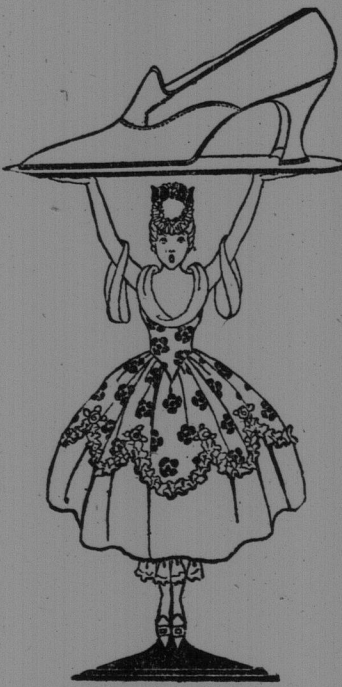

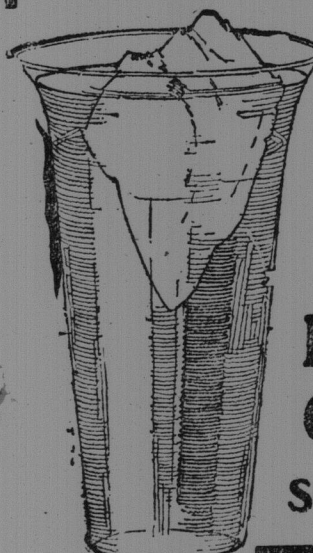

BAPTISTS MET AT WILSON'S BEACH

The annual meeting of the United Baptist churches of St. John county west and Charlotte county was held at Wilson's Beach, July 11-13. Rev. J. A. Corey reported on home missions and his report was discussed by Revs. J. H. Jenner and A. S. Bishop. Rev. E. Bosworth, D. D., told of the work of the Grand Ligne mission and Rev. and Mrs. I. C. Archibald, who have been forty years in India, gave an interesting account of their work. Dr. Cullen, president of Acadia, outlined the work of that institution and Rev. R. O. Morse reported on Sunday schools.
Resolutions endorsing the work of Rev. W. D. Wilson, chief liquor inspector, and the social service council for Canada, and condemning the action of the senate with regard to prohibition were passed.
The clerk, Rev. J. H. Jenner, gave the

summary of statistics showing 138 baptised during the year.
The newly elected officers for the district are:
Chairman, D. C. Clark, Esq.; vice-chairman, Rev. A. S. Bishop; secretary-treasurer, Rev. J. H. Jenner; assistant secretary, Rev. H. E. deWolfe; preacher of annual sermon, Rev. R. O. Morse.

MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

In an address to his Dewdney constituents last night, Premier Oliver of British Columbia said that an effort had been made by the Bolshevik wing of the social democratic party in Canada of late to induce a revolution by working on the feelings of returned soldiers, but they had been unsuccessful.

The Canadian authorities in England have issued a statement explaining the reason why no Canadian soldiers will be in the peace parade. All the organized units have been repatriated, they said, and only individuals remain.

At the convention of the Nova Scotia Great War Veterans in New Glasgow yesterday a resolution was passed announcing that they would have no relations of any kind with any organization in whose ranks were aliens of enemy birth or extraction.

Diamond rings valued at about \$2,500 were stolen recently from the store of Melanson & Co., jewelers, Moncton. The loss was not discovered until yesterday. German engineers are reported to have created a gasoline turbine which will enable airplanes to fly noiselessly.

MAY CAUSE LOSS OF OF E. S. S. SERVICE

Unless the regulation calling for the vaccination of all persons travelling from St. John by the Eastern Steamship Corporation steamers is lifted, it is expected that the service will be withdrawn, according to a statement made last evening.

The board of trade has obtained a certificate from the board of health that there is no smallpox in St. John and has wired Washington to this effect, asking for action to be taken. On the last trip of the boat from here passengers were stopped at Eastport and not allowed to proceed unless they could show a certificate of vaccination or submit to vaccination. The regulation applies to all passengers, even those returning to their homes in the United States by boat, but it is understood that it is not required by those traveling by train.
