News of the Boxers.

Says Dan Saunders in the Boston Globe:—"The proposition that has caused promoter McCarey of Los Angeles to butt into the game in New Orleans appears to be a good one. The business men of that city, who want McCarey, will put up \$50,000 toward building a \$75,000 arena, and McCarey will add the remaining \$25,000. McCarey will be allowed to take 50 per cent of the profits. Last night, a fight between Leon and France show that the boxing contingent in the war continues to suffer from the fire of the Germans. Capt. Chesle of the Royal Sussex, killed at La Bassée, was a famous amateur boxer and all-round athlete. Last year he won the competitive military championship. Jack Dias, an English boxer, died of wounds received at Mons. Joe Shears is with the Canadian troops. Capt. Pusey, former amateur welterweight champion of England, has been killed, and Bill Smith, a well-known light heavy, has been badly wounded. Jack McCusker, the best welterweight in Ireland, is at the front with the Irish Guards. He holds the Western Command championship. Battling Taylor, a little Australian fighter, has been raised to the rank of corporal for bravery under fire. Dick Morbey, another English fighter, who joined the Naval Reserves, has been badly injured. Leon Sec, owner and publisher of the French boxing paper Boxe et Boxeurs, is driving a motor car at the front. Ed Kelly, a widely known pugilist of the '80s, died in St. Louis this week. He had a long ring record of victories several years ago. He fought Dan Daly sixty rounds, and the battle was said to have been one of the severest in the history of the ring. His father, Tom Kelly, was the lightweight champion at one time. During one of his son's fights Tom is credited with having cut off his son's split lip with a jackknife between the rounds in order to leave Ed unimpaired by the swollen flesh. The boxers at the front in the European war evidently find time to indulge in the other kind of scrapping, for 1403 sets of gloves have already been forwarded to them. In England the knowledge of boxing is regarded as one of the most valuable adjuncts to military training. Boxing at a club where there are 1,000 present and only 800 in the box office is not a pleasant state of affairs for a scrapper to confront. Some of them have fared worse, but one of Leo Flynn's string of boxers met that fate in Northampton New York the other night. The promoter said there would be only 25 complimentary. Before the doors were opened, Flynn says the promoter stated: "Now we have a board of sheriffs in this town—just a few fellows who will display their shields when they come along. We are in the habit of admiring them. I said: 'That's all right, let 'em pass.' Well, the crowd began to file in. I guess out of the first 50 persons who passed in the door forty of them displayed sheriff's badges. And they kept coming in blocks. When there were about 400 persons in the house and the board of sheriffs was still jamming the entrance I said suddenly: 'Say, Mister Manager, suppose somebody should show up with a bought and paid for, where are you going to put him?' 'As fast as the fellows with the badges got in some collected them, sneaked out the back door and sold them for \$1 a smash.' Penions For Ring Champions The National Sporting Club of London has awarded pensions of \$5 a week to all boxers who have won the Lonsdale belt, to go into effect when they have reached fifty years of age.


