Dublin, June 8—"Will Ulster fight?" i Dublin, June 8—"Will Ulster fight?" is a question which is being asked by many sincere friends of Ireland and the answer to it depends on the politics of its giver. There are a lot of eminent politicians in the North of Ireland who are declaring loudly that "Ulster," by which they mean Belfast, Derry and the country lying between them, will fight in the event of the passage of the home rule bill by parliament, and they back up this assertion by terrible tales of drilling and arming by "loyalists" in the Orange lodges.

Only a few weeks ago Lord Mayor McMordie of Belfast, declared, in the House of Commons, that he knew that 60,000 young men in Belfast owned revolvers and that there were 100,000 of these deadly weapons in the hands of Unionists in the North of Ireland, while there were between 200,000 and 300,000 in the hands of Nationalists in the same area.

"What do they want these revolvers for if not to use them?" asked the Belfast Lord Mayor, and he pursued his policy of making British flesh creep by vague hints of thousands of rifles which he declared had been smuggled into Ireland in cargoes of coal.
