

## PROVINCIAL TITLE AT STAKE TONIGHT

**Trojan Intermediates Must Overcome 15 Point Lead to Win Out.**

The final game for the provincial intermediate title tonight at the Y. M. C. A. between Moncton Pawnees and the local Trojan Intermediates five is expected to be one of the most hotly-contested mix-ups for some time in local basketball circles. When the teams met here a few weeks ago, the Trojans won by 16 points, or a margin of one point for copying the title. It transpires that the enthusiastic rooting by a spectator in favor of the Moncton team made it necessary for "Ed" Ketchum, who refereed the game, to call a penalty on the Pawnees.
