DISCOUNT RATE INCREASE HAS MARKED EFFECT

Traditional "Selling on the Good News" Also a Factor

BRAZILIAN IS AGAIN FEATURE IN MONTREAL

Has Turnover of 7,000 Shares at Canadian Financial Centre Gets Record

NEW YORK, Aug. 13.—Heavy liquidation, inspired by the unexpected increase in the New York Federal Reserve discount rate and the traditional "selling on the good news" factor, imparted a decidedly reactionary tone to the opening of today's stock market. General Motors opened at a point lower at 29 3/4. Dupont broke 4 1/2 points and declined a point or two were recorded in the first minutes of trading by United States Steel common, American Gas, American Smelting, Hudson Motors, and Baldwin Locomotive.

AT MONTREAL

MONTREAL, Aug. 13.—Brazilian was by far the most outstanding feature during the early trading of the local stock exchange this morning. A turnover of approximately 7,000 shares, this issue touched a new record for all time at 114.1-8. It opened at 112 for an overnight gain of one-quarter point, eased back to 111 1/4, later moved forward to the new high, but reacted around 10.30 to 111 1/8 for a net gain of one-eighth. Smelters were moderately active and strong, opening at 29 3/4, up a half, and was in fairly good demand at that level. The power issues were quiet. Montreal Power being the only stock of this group to make its appearance on the board. This issue sold unchanged at 22 1/2. Ogilvie scored a point advance on a broken bid sale at 186. The rest of the list was quiet.

In consequence of the situation, the Duke of Abruzzi has suspended his official visit to Addis-Abeba. His visit was planned to dispel rumors of strained relations between the two governments.

PROFITS INCREASED

MONTREAL, Aug. 13.—The annual financial statement of Toole Bros. Ltd., and subsidiary companies for the fiscal year ended June 30, shows net profits at \$116,770. This compared with \$100,824 in the preceding 18-month period, when the fiscal year ending of the company was changed from May 31 to June 30.

DRY SLEUTHS ATTEND SCHOOL OF INSTRUCTION

PITTSBURGH, Aug. 13.—Prohibition agents in this section of the country are now attending classes before becoming full-fledged sleuths. This was one of the innovations initiated by John D. Pennington when he assumed supervision of the Fourth United States District, which includes Central and Western Pennsylvania.

Ray, who resigned after one month of service was accompanied by an attack on the present economic machinery.


