Boston, Oct. 23—Extensive additions to the service now maintained between this port and Great Britain by the Cunard and Anchor lines will be made soon, according to an anonuncement by A. C. F. Henderson, managing director of the Anchor Lines.

It will be the first time in the history of the port that Boston has ever had a line to that part of Europe.

TAX IS NOTHING TO BE AFRAID OF

An Explanation in Regard to The New Issue of Victory Bonds

In some unaccountable manner an impression has become prevalent that subscribers to the 1919 Victory Loan will have to pay income tax on the full amount of the bonds. That is quite wrong. The income tax will be payable on the interest derived from the bonds and then only in cases where the total income exceeds \$1,000 per year in the case of a single person and \$2,000 in the case of a married person. Up to that amount income is exempt from the federal tax. There is a further exemption applying to married persons with young children. For each dependent child under

the age of eighteen years an exemption of the income tax on \$200 is allowed.

exempt from taxation on income not exceeding \$2,800. It will be readily seen that the person with the average income is not affected at all by the tax on the Victory Bonds. In any event it must be borne in mind BOSTON AND EUROPE that the tax is not on the amount of the bond but only on the interest received. For instance, a \$100 bond will pay \$5.50 a year interest on which the tax of 4 per cent would amount to 22 cents, if the income of the bondholder was larger than the amounts named as was larger than the amounts named as exempt under the act.
