The Rev. Jas. Barclay, being very desirous of solving the problem of keeping the older boys in the school, undertook to teach a class of boys over fourteen. The effort has been most successful, the class now numbering 24, with an average attendance of about 18; unfortunately there is no proper accommodation for such a class and it has to be taught in the back room by gas light.

The teachers have been much encouraged by the presence of the elders, two of whom visit the school each Sunday and they are particularly indebted to Mr. Croil for frequent visits and addresses given by him upon Missionary subjects.
