Summary of the Provincial Acts for the Preservation of Game.

Section 1.—No person shall hunt, take, kill, wound or destroy any moose, caribou or deer from 1st day of January to the 31st day of August in any year under a penalty of a sum not exceeding \$50 nor less than \$10 for each and every such act...

Section 2.—No one person or number of persons forming a hunting party shall during the time allowed for killing moose, caribou or deer in any year or season kill or take more than three moose, five caribou, or five deer...

Section 3.—The flesh of any moose or caribou that may be killed shall be carried out of the woods within ten days after killing the animal, except as regards moose, caribou or deer killed in the latter part of December, which may be carried out within the first five days of January...

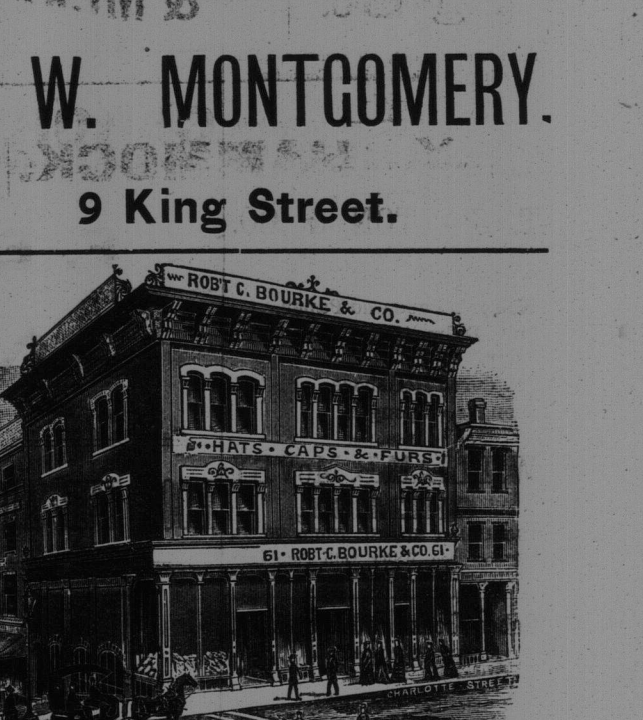
