HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

English Cakes. The following recipes of English cakes and sweet rolls are given. The sweet rolls are a feature of English cookery. The sweet roll is always kept well supplied, and these are some of the recipes for making them.

Small Plum Cakes.

Mix six ounces of powdered loaf sugar with one ounce of flour, to which add six ounces of butter, beaten to a cream, three well beaten eggs, and one-half pound of currants; beat all in a stiff paste, which dump on floured tin plates, and bake in a brisk oven.

Family Pound Cake.

Beat to a cream half a pound of butter, add one pound of dried flour, half a pound of powdered loaf sugar, half a pound of dried currants, four well beaten eggs and half a pint of milk; beat well together and bake in a quick oven.
