The vessel is owned and manned by Jews, and is the first of a fleet for which Zionists plan an ultimate appropriation of \$10,000.00. The vessel was formerly a German craft, and was purchased to ply along the Palestine coast, making the ports of Bierut, Jaffa, Gaza and several others in Egypt. The Zionist censineers plan to convert Haifa into one of the leading important commercial centres of the Near East.
