EXPENDITURE.

SCHOOLS.—The Society have now in operation three Church Schools, one at Chester receiving an annual grant of £20; one at Weymouth, and one at Margaret's Bay, receiving yearly £10 each.—The expenditure under this head during the past year has been £30.

VISITING MISSIONARIES.—The Committee rejoice to think that the expenditure in this department of the Society's benevolent operations is likely to be largely increased. Two Missionaries are already engaged by the Society, and entered upon their work with encouraging success, at a salary of £150, together with travelling expenses; and a member of the General Committee has given notice of his intention to move at no distant day, for the employment of six additional Missionaries, to be supported in part from the funds of this Society, himself guaranteeing the salary of one such Missionary.

The expenditure for missionary objects during the past year, including £20 granted to the Ven. the Archdeacon to meet missionary

visits in Cape Breton, amounts to £138 10.

CHURCHES.—In this department £165 have been expended, and assistance thus afforded in the erection or enlargement of eleven Churches, several of which could not have been completed but for the well timed aid of the Society.

The Churches assisted and the amount granted to each, will appear

in Treasurer's Account appended to this Report.

STUDENTS AT WINDSOR.—Three young Gentlemen Students at Windsor College, have availed themselves of the assistance which the Society holds out for the encouragement of the pious and deserving who may need its aid while qualifying themselves for the sacred Ministry at that University. One of these is now ordained, and gives promise of being an active and useful Missionary. The other two are still pursuing their studies with a view to Holy Orders.—Sum expended £70 15.

BOOKS.—As in former years the local Committees have generally availed themselves of the privilege of receiving back in books the

amount of one fourth of their remittance.

There has been paid into the Book fund during the past year on this account, together with some special grants, the sum of £109 7 11. The particulars are given at large in the Treasurer's Account appended to this Report.

There has been issued from the Depository of the Society during the part year, 70 Bibles, 200 Testaments, 1,080 Prayer Books, 4,997

Tracts, 1,218 bound Books, and other Publications.
