

SCHOOL BOOKS FORTY PER CENT. CHEAPER Hon. Mr. Fleming Signed Contract With Gage & Co., of Toronto, Saturday TO LAST THREE YEARS

Indefinite Term Contract Also Signed for Supply of Scribblers, Also at 40 Per Cent. Reduction on Old Prices -To Interview Ottawa Government About Double Subsidy on the Central.

Hon. J. D. Hazen and Hon. J. K. Fleming, provincial secretary, left on Saturday evening for Montreal to look into the question of disposing of the loan of \$1,000,000 which was mature on August 15. Before leaving, Mr. Fleming signed a contract with Gage & Co., of Toronto for primers and readers up to the eighth grade to be supplied to the public schools of this province at a reduction of 40 per cent. on the old prices.

Another contract was signed with the same firm to supply scribblers at a 40 per cent. reduction. No time was specified for the length of this contract. On completion of the business in Montreal, the premier will proceed to Ottawa to interview the Dominion government with regard to the payment of the double subsidy on the Central Railway which was claimed by the late government to be due the province as against a bill of the I. C. R. for \$47,000 for rails and ties.

Hon. W. C. H. Grammer, surveyor general, returned to St. Stephen on Saturday evening. He will leave tomorrow for Madawaska to investigate certain titles, and expects to be in Fredericton on Thursday. Hon. John Morrissey, chief commissioner of public works, will also be in Madawaska the early part of this week, on a tour of inspection. On a date yet to be arranged this month, Mr. Fleming will go to Campbellton as a commissioner appointed to investigate the liquor license, the New Brunswick Temperance Federation having protested against the number that have been granted.

The person moderator has borne the honors easily, and the long journey from Montreal did not draw noticeably upon his strength, for the duties of the service and preaching were both in the spirit and vigor of youth.

SWELTERING HEAT AT FREDERICTON Thermometer Registered 87 in the Shade Yesterday SHORTAGE GROWS It is Reported That Auditor on Late W. P. Flewelling's Book Has Found So Far \$20,000 Unaccounted For -Purse for Cathedral Organist.

Fredericton, N. B., June 7.—A genuine hot wave struck the city today, the thermometer registering 87 in the shade. Fortunately a stiff breeze prevailed, the greater part of the day, making the heat less oppressive than it otherwise would have been. Prof. Isherwood-Plummer, organist of the Cathedral, who lately joined the benedict ranks was this evening at the close of service presented with a purse of \$100. The presentation was made in the Cathedral vestry by Dean Schofield, on behalf of the trustees, choir and congregation. It was made a happy speech, warmly congratulating Mr. and Mrs. Isherwood-Plummer on their marriage and wishing them every happiness. Mr. Isherwood-Plummer, Sub-Dean Street also made a few remarks and Mr. Isherwood-Plummer made a suitable reply.

It is reported that the special audit of the books of the late W. P. Flewelling, deputy surveyor general, the shortage so far discovered runs up to about \$20,000, instead of \$12,000 as previously stated. It is understood that some three or four years ago, shortly after the general elections of 1903, a shortage of about \$13,000 developed and while it is not clear that this shortage was fixed up in some way or other there is nothing to show how it was fixed up, if it ever was; in fact there is nothing to show whether it ever was actually straightened out. So far as the guarantee company is concerned, it is stated on the street, that the company claim to be responsible for the shortage which occurred during the last year, on the grounds that when the audit was last renewed it was represented to them that everything was all right and there did not then exist any shortage.

On Thursday, Mr. Naeson, the special auditor, Mr. R. S. Miller, C. A., of Montreal, who has been engaged on the audit for some time, will make a report to the surveyor general and the government within the course of a few days. Mr. H. R. Boyer, has resigned the pastorate of the Baptist church at Givison. His resignation will take effect at the first of September after which he will continue his theological studies at the Newton Theological Seminary, at Newton, Mass. The injuries received by Herman Naeson on Thursday, when he was kicked by a horse, have not improved. He was taken to the hospital on Saturday morning. He was adjusting harness on a valuable mare at his home and was in the act of unbuckling the crooper when the mare suddenly kicked him in the stomach and fell to the ground striking him in pain. Dr. H. R. Naeson, who was a widower, was forty-seven years of age, and is survived by four children, who have the sympathy of a large circle of friends in their great bereavement.
