

prescribed for such students, before they can be permitted to enter upon the regular theological course (see page 32).

9. All students during their first year shall be on probation. Matriculated students taking the first year's work in Arts, and non-matriculated students during their first year, shall be known as probationary students.

10. All probationary students must complete all the requirements of the curriculum, and must satisfy the Council as to their spiritual and literary fitness for the work of the ministry, before they can be permitted to enter upon the regular theological course.

11. All probationary students must take during their year the lectures on "The Outlines of Theology" and the lectures on the books of the New Testament, prescribed for all students. But they cannot be permitted to take any other portion of the theological course during their preparatory year.

12. Regular students of the College are (a) Graduates in Arts of some recognized University; (b) Matriculated Students who have passed the examination of the first year in Arts; or (c) Such exceptional non-Matriculated Students as the Council may have admitted to entrance (see page 32), who have passed the prescribed entrance examination and the examinations of the probationary year.
