The system of publishing an official report dates from 1875. The work was performed under contract from 1875 to 1880 inclusive. In 1880 a permanent staff was appointed, the Reporters being made officers of the House.

There are three editions of the Debates published. The daily edition contains the speeches in the language in which they are delivered. The editions in book form are issued in both the English and French languages.
