GRANT, JAMES ALEXANDER, M.D., F.G.S., F.R.C.S. (Edin.) [*Russell.*]

S. of the late Dr. James Grant, a well known physician in Co. Glengarry, Ont.; and grands. of James Grant, Esq., of Corrimony, Scot., author of *Essays on the Origin of Society, Thoughts on the Origin and Descent of the Gael*, who was an advocate in Edinburgh, and at the time of his death (1835) the father of the Scottish Bar. (See Anderson's *Scottish Nation*.) B. in Inverness-shire, Scot., Augt., 1829. Came to Can. with his parents, 1830. Ed. at the University of Queen's College, Kingston, in arts, and at McGill College, Montreal, in medicine. Took the degree of M.D. at latter institution, 1854. M., 1855, Maria, second dau. of the late Ed. Malloch, Esq., who sat for Carleton in the L.A. of U.O. before, and in the L.A. Can., after the Union of 1840. A Fellow of the Geological Society, Eng. and of the Royal College of Surgeons, (Edin.); mem. of the Royal College of Surgeons, (Lon.), and of the Royal College of Physicians (Lon.) and a corresponding mem. of the Academy of Natural Sciences, Phil-
