Reds off to AUAAs

In tomorrow's AUAAs Championships at St. Francis Xavier the Varsity Reds Cross Country the men's team hopes to capture their fifth consecutive AUAAs title and the women's squad is hoping for a respectable finish. Last year the men's side captured their fourth consecutive AUAAs title and placed fifth at the CIAU's.

The Reds are familiar with the course that will be used for the AUAAs as it was the course they competed on the 2nd of October and at that meet, the men's team won while the women's team placed a close third.

In the Championship meet Reds runners Bryan Pollman, Keith Fahey, Kenny Hunter, and Ian Washburn are favored to put in a strong showing. While on the women's side Jennifer Phillips, Marnie Bray, Sara Crooker, Megan Roushorne and Joanne Bellavance have had strong performances so far this season.

The men's team lost five veterans from last year's AUAAs squad and will have to depend on a few of last year's rookies for strong showings at the Championship.

The women's team has been in a building stage all year and Coach Randall expects that with a year or two of AUAAs experience the team should be a competitive unit. In addition the team lost the services of last year's coach Rick Hull, who has been replaced by former Cross Country star Tim Randall.

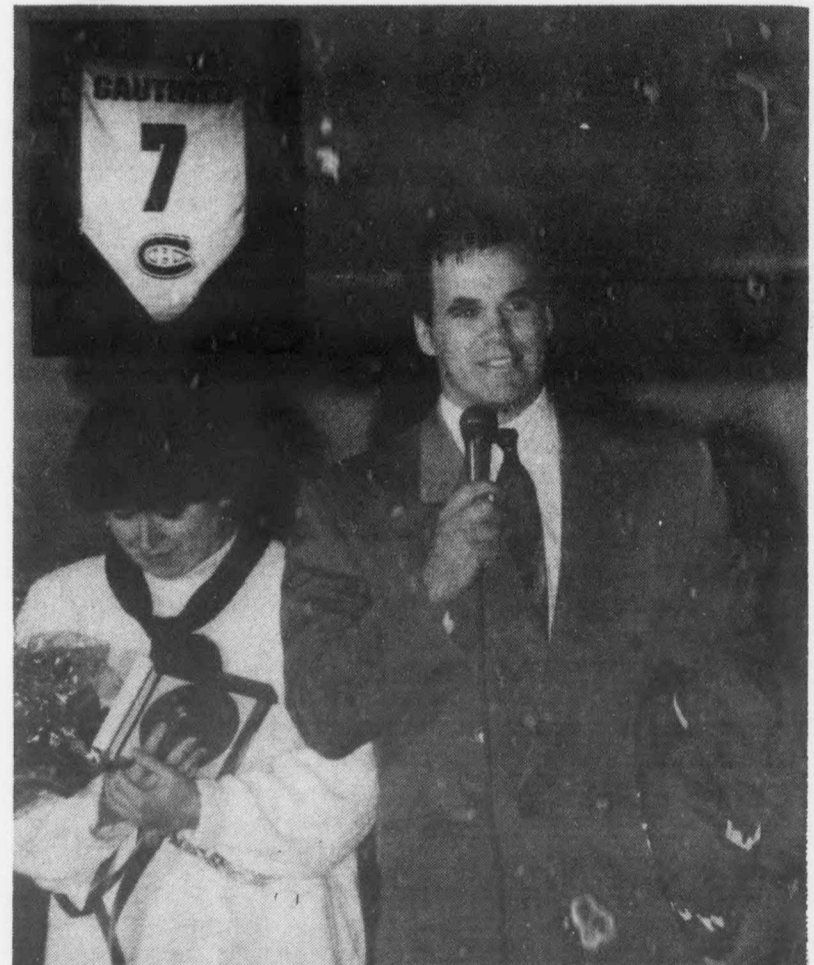
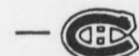
At the Championships, it is expected that there will be tight race between perennial rivals Dalhousie and UNB on the men's side. There have been approximately 25 to 30 runners coming out on a regular basis to practice and the runners earn a trip to the AUAAs by finishing in the top seven during time trial practices.

If the team wins the Championship then they will compete in the CIAU's on 6 November in Halifax and Dalhousie will compete as the host team.
