Sir

It might be well to have the amount of land patented to the Canadian Pacific Railway at Brockton on the Peigan Indian Reserve looked into.

The Right of way plan shows a large amount of land taken, but I have been informed by Inspector Martle that the Engineers of that Company state that this area was reserved for the Company in case they required it, but a less area was taken and paid for.

If this is the case the present office will be on the Reserve instead of on the Railway property, as well as the store belonging to Mr McLeod and the store formerly occupied by Mr Leonard.

It would not affect the survey made by me two years ago, but the plan of the lands laid out for Indian purposes will require to be changed accordingly.
