

I have a copy of a letter  
written by Rev. W. McDonald P.P.  
in March/83 to the Supr. Council  
of Indian Affairs at Ottawa  
stating that there was then  
a scarcity of wood on the  
Indian Reserve at Picton  
and that the Chief and  
Captain had asked him  
to get this land for them.

I think you would not have  
much trouble getting the  
sum asked if you can just  
spare a few moments to  
attend to it. R. P. Fraser  
has been promising to attend  
to this for me for so long a  
time that I have at last  
concluded to take it in  
myself. He (R. P.) has

land at Fishers Grant  
owned by the writer but  
deeded to R. P. Fraser

about thirty acres and  
the price asked was \$300<sup>00</sup>
