Dear Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 26th ultimo, reporting that Wm. Johnson, a soldier settler of Walpole Island, has abandoned his loan and that you recommend an Indian civilian Earle Sands, a member of the Walpole Island Band, to take over this loan. Under the circumstances the Department approves of the transfer and the prices at which Sands will take over the effects will be as follows:-
