Sirs,

With reference to letter of the Snd. of March last respecting your accounts amounting to \$990.20 for supplies issued during the winter of 1907 - 08 at your posts at Trout Lake and Chipewyan Lake , I beg to say that the Department has heard from the Rev. Mr. Weaver who reports that in the accounts there are the names of several men took serip and mentions, Geo. Gray-eyes, Daniel and Semuel Houle, Saul Auger and Fred Grasshead, who should not have required assistance or at least the Department should not be charged with it.

There are several boys on the list who are char with supplies to east extent as married men who have fare ilies to keep. The Cat is charged with \$19.25. His son Co John is charged with \$20.70 , the latter is a young boy living at home. Saul Auger (Scrip) quite a boy living wi his Uncle is charged with \$16.80. These charges require be explained.

It is also reported that your Agents at these outposts had no authority to issue gratuitous rations and any rations issued were charged up to the individuals with are expested to pay for same. In some cases of destin
