(\$40.00) and arrears (\$20.00) for the same number of persons for 1907. The amounts applied for were forwarded to the Agent for the Indians.

These persons did not appear at the pay-table in 1908 or 1909 and consequently were not paid.

No. 4. Arrears of \$12.00 are due this family for 1907.

No explanation appears in the pay-list which apparently is due to the fact that the Indian Agent cannot at all times account for the absence of Indian payees from the pay-table.

ABITTIBI BAND

Nos. 1 & 2 & 7. Cheques to pay arreers of annuities

for the years 1906 and 1907 were sent to

these families. They refused to accept them.

The cheques were returned to the Department and

cancelled. Meanwhile the claims were made on you

for \$12.00, \$48.00 and \$8.00. The Department

regrets having overlooked refunding these amounts

to you.

Nos. 53 and 3 Abittibi Band, and Nos. 159, 171 and 177
Fort Hope Band, will be communicated to you as soon as
