APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT to Prospect for Petroleum and Natural Gas under the provisions of the Regulations for the disposal of Oil and Gas Rights on Indian Reserves as amended by Orders in Council dated 12th day of March, 1929, P.C.'s 423, 424.

1. I, Frank A. Patrick, of 1805 West Georgia Street, Vancouver, B. C., Manager, hereby apply for a permit to prospect for petroleum and natural gas in the following lands in the No.1, No.2 and No.4 Quesnel Indian Reserves, which area, with that I have already acquired by application under the provisions of the permit regulations, does not exceed the maximum area of 1,920 acres.

The said No.1, No.2 and No.4 Quesnel Indian Reserves are situate on the Fraser River between 1 and 4 miles South of the Town of Quesnel in the Cariboo District in the Province of British Columbia.

2. I tender herewith a fee of \$5.00 and the sum , which represents rental at the rate of ten cents an acre; also a deposit or eash bond of forty cents an acre, as required by the permit regulations. This deposit or cash bond is made as a guarantee that I will incur an expenditure in core drilling or other like operations on the location applied for, equal to the amount thereof, (\$ \_\_\_\_\_\_\_) the said deposit or cash bond to be subject to forfeiture for failure to comply with the regulations in this behalf, or to refund or return upon evidence being submitted of full compliance therewith.
