with the special character and habits &c educational and technical acquirements possessed by them. It is necessary that you should make periodical visits to the various bands of Indians in the Agency. A list of the names of the Indians men, women and children - in the Agency should be prepared by you to establish the membership of the Bands.

Particular attention should be given to the sanitary conditions of the Indian settlements and camps, and where it is noticed that filth or garbage of any kind has been allowed to remain in the vicinity, the Indian should be told how to dispose of it so that it will not be a menace to their health.

It is an important part of your duties to see that the physician's render all necessary attandenace to the Indians. There are two medical officers for your Agency; they are employed on salary, Dr. A. Ross Fraser of Masset who is paid \$500. a year, and Dr. J. C. Spencer \$400. per year for which payments medicines are also to be supplied. Monthly reports are required from them, and should be forwarded through you. They are supplied with a form No.15 for the purpose, omitting charges for medicine and attendance. It is not considered in necessary to supply the following articles to destitute Indians, except in case of sickness, viz; sugar, tea, yeast-powder and soap. De tailed information should be furnished on the vouchers after as to the necessity for giving supplies in each case.

Vouchers for your expenditure in travelling on duty should be forwarded to the Department at the end of each month. No other expenditure should be made from the advance for travelling expenses. When a fresh travelling advance is required it will be forwarded to you by the Department upon the satisfactory rendering of your travelling expense returns. A travelling expense diary should also be furnished by you.

You should counsel your Indians against intruding or trespassing upon the lands, fisheries &c of other people or Indians.
