Our rivals depend on public favor by offering a big book, which includes the names of youths of both sexes from 16 years of age, by giving the addresses of workmen at their places of employment, and names of casual visitors and non-residents; in short, everything to make a large and attractive-looking work. All this is not only superfluous, but annoying and misleading, as every employer well knows. Supposing any Canadian undertook to publish a Directory of the city of Detroit, the headquarters and residence of Messrs. R. L. Polk & Co., what would be the chance of success? Would he not soon hear there was sufficient intelligence, patriotism and encouragement for home industry without the interference of CANA-DIANS and FOREIGNERS?

We respectfully solicit the continued support of our fellow-citizens, assured that the city of Hamilton will never submit to the reproach of being in this essentially local matter a mere outpost of Detroit, Mich., or a small link in the chain of a foreign and selfish monopoly. R. L. Polk & Co. publish the directories of Toronto and the province of Ontario. How long would a Canadian be permitted to publish the directories of Washington and the District of Columbia? "Headquarters for publishing Canadian directories, Detroit, Mich.; branch office, Toronto; sub-office, Hamilton," don't look well. It is too anti-British-Canadian.
