2.5 2 6, for expences incurred by him in the year 1799, in fending a Person from Guysborough to Halifax, with the King's Writs, for electing Representatives for faid County; and praying a reimbursement of the same.

Ordered, That the faid Petitions be feverally referred to the Committee of Claims.

Then the House adjourned till To-morrow at Eleven of the Clock.

The faid amendments were read throughout a first and second time, and upon the question severally put thereupon

Ordered, That the Bill, with the amendments be engroffed.

Mr. Wallace pursuant to leave given, presented a Bill for repairing the Streets, &c. in the Town of Halifax, and the same was read a first time.

Mr. Fulton pursuant to leave given presented a Bill for fecuring the owners of Land in the western parts of Londonderry, in the peaceable enjoyment of their Land, and the same was read a first time.

Refolved, That the faid Bills be feverally read a fecond time.

On Motion, the report of the Committee respecting a settlement on the Mand of Sable, was read, and thereupon,

On Motion of Mr. Wallace, refolved, that a Committee be appointed to prepare an Address to His Excellency, the Lieutenant-Governor, on the subject of the said Report, and

Ordered, That Mr. Tonge, Mr. Wallace, and Mr. Morris, be a Committee for the above purpose.
