A SEA MONSTER VISITS ST. ANDREWS

The staff of the Biological Station report the visit to the shores of St. Andrews, on Friday and Saturday last, of an interesting member of the sea monster family.

The beluga is a toothed whale, related to the grampus, the porpoise and the dolphin. Its length ranges from 12 to 30 feet, though some are said to reach 25 to 30 feet.

It is a rare visitor to the Bay of Fundy, plentiful in the estuary of the St. Lawrence, but very abundant in Hudson's Bay. The Hudson's Bay Co. have carried on extensively the capture of white whales in traps, arranged inshore, like sardine weirs, but on a larger scale.
