One of the Founders of the Irish Land League Passes. peacefully and painlessly at 12 c'clock in the presence of his eldest son, Michael, and his two daughters, who had devotedly attended him through his illness, and of many of his most intimate friends, including John Dillon. Shortly before his death, Father Hatton had been with him. Mrs. Davitt, Hatton had been with him. Mrs. Davitt, who had been in constant attendance on her husband until a few days ago, when she herself was taken ill, lies prostrated in the same hospital, too weak to leave her room. Michael Davitt had been for the past forty years prominently identified

past forty years prominently identified with the Irish Nationalist party. It was in 1865 that he came into notice by entering into the Fenian Brotherhood. Five years the Fenian Brotherhood. Five years later he was arrested and tried in London for treason, and was sentenced to fifteen years penal servitude, his release being secured on ticket of leave in 1877. Two years later he with the late Mr. Parnell and others, founded the Irish Land League. Afterwards, politically, he had many ups and downs.
