

YOUR VOTE TWENTY-FIFTH OF OCTOBER

The question on the Referendum ballot is: "Shall the importation or bringing of intoxication liquors into the province be forbidden?" It is written twice on the ballot, and after the question in the upper part is the word "No" and in the lower "Yes". Within the space containing the question there is room for the voter to make a cross (X) after "No" or "Yes".

We trust an overwhelming majority will make the cross after "YES" and thus express the conviction that importation should be prohibited.

The Act clearly states that the prohibition applies only to intoxicating liquors for beverage purposes. Prohibition will not prevent importation for sacramental, medical, manufacturing or commercial purposes.

The Dominion Elections Act provides that the voters' lists used in the recent provincial elections shall be the basis of the lists to be used on the twenty-fifth of October. To these lists may be added the names of such persons, male or female, of the age of twenty-one years, as are qualified.

There will be one urban registrar for every 4,000 people in the cities, towns and incorporated villages with population of 1,000 or more, who will have their registration places selected and their notices posted by the fifth of September, and sit daily between the thirteenth and eighteenth.

There will be one rural registrar for every polling division. Rural registrars are not required to go to work until the latter part of September. They complete their enumeration by October sixth.

Revising officers and registrars will advertise in the newspapers or by posted notice their names and post office addresses and the days and hours when they shall attend to their duties.

If a person neglects or omits to apply for registration at any sitting of the registrar, he may have his name entered, if, after examination the revising officer is of the opinion that he possesses the necessary qualifications.

At polling stations in rural polling divisions any person whose name is not on the list, may have his or her name added while the poll is open by conforming to certain regulations.

It will be well for persons whose names were not on the lists used in the recent provincial elections to avail themselves of the opportunity that will be given to have their names added.
