

An exchange furnishes an account of the remarkable career of a forger. A messenger sent from England to track an American forger named Gray has returned. He was actually arrested in London; but contrived to dodge the officers. He lived previous to that in magnificent style, kept his brougham, dined with Baron Rothschild, and surpassed the Prince of Wales in the elegance of his equipages. He was looked on as an American millionaire, and easily got an advance of £500 on a forged telegram that \$30,000 had been placed to his credit. Before the arrest he was reported to be in several places on the continent, but was believed to be all the time in London. This man was the son of a Chaplain to the United States Senate, and began life in the Auditor's office. Thence he went to New York, got into the stockbroking, and obtained a partnership with a Mr. Fink. In this position he had excellent opportunities for fraud, which he turned to such good account as to have victimized various persons to the extent of \$300,000.
