

An exchange furnishes an account of the remarkable career of a forger, a messenger sent from England to Gray has returned. He was actually arrested in London; but contrived to escape. He lived in magnificent style, kept his brougham, dined with Baron Rothschild, and surpassed the Prince of Wales in the elegance of his equipages.
