How to Make Peach or Pear Jam

Peel, remove pits or seeds and crush well about 3 lbs. fruit. Measure 4 level cups (2 lbs.) crushed fruit into large kettle. Add 7½ level cups (3¾ lbs.) sugar, and mix well. Use hottest fire, and stir constantly before and while boiling. Boil hard for one minute. Remove from fire and stir in 1 bottle (scant cup) Certo (3¼ lbs.) sugar, and mix well. 16,000 Immigrants Came Last Month

The total number of immigrants to enter Canada during the month of July was about 16,000. Exact figures are not yet available, reports from a few of the ports not having reached the Department of Immigration here, but the above total is approximately correct. Immigration from the United States was about normal, while there was an increase of immigration coming from the British Isles. The closing of a large employment agency at Detroit is regarded as having the effect of turning a large number of Canadians who had gone to that city, back to Canada. It is stated.
