Facts For Marksmen.

A series of experiments made in rance on the vibrations set up in un barrels by the effects of firing gun barrels by the effects of firing indicates another allowance that the expert marksman should make for the individual peculiarities of his rife. The shock of firing sets the particles of the gun barrel oscillating in elliptic curves, producing deflections of the barrel. The periods of vibration in different rifles vary between one twenty-fifth and one five-hundredth of a second, and the experiments indicate that a small-bore gun is to be preferred to one of large calibre, because the bullet can leave its muzzle before the deflection of the barrel has become considerable.—Washington Star.
