The Society now maintains elev: n mis-sions in British Columbia and Manitoba. with nine missionaries ; thirty-four mis-sions-to the Indians of the Saskatchewan. Hudson Bay Territory, British Columbia and the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec, with twenty-eight missionaries and four-assistants ; 188 doncetic missions in Ontario and Quebec, with 158 mission-aries ; four mission to the Germans, with four missionaries ; five missions to the French, with four missionaries, and one paid agent-in all 192 missions and 203 missionaries. The numbers in con-metion with the church at the different stations are as follows:--In British Co-lumbia and Manitoba, 390 ; Indian and Saskatahewan, Hudson Bay Territory, British Columbia and Ontario and Que-bec, 2,253 ; . in the domestic missions, 14,441 ; French and German missions, 14,441 ; French and German missions, 293-in al 17,383. The Society main-tans twenty-one day schools, twenty-one tocal assistants to missionaries, making a total paid agency amouning to 272 labor-ers in the different departments of the missionary work.


