# MRS. JOHN COTTAM IS SUPERINTENDENT OF LONDON W. M S.

### Missionary Tells of Educational Work Among the Chinese Girls:

Mrs. John Cottam of this city was yesterday elected district superintendent of the London district Women's Missionary Society, which convened here in the Dundas Centre Methodist Church, as many as 200 delegates coming to the city for the occasion. This election took place at the afternoon session, together with that of the secretary-treasurer, Mrs. B. H. Cle-

ment.

The big meeting of the convention, however, took place in 'the evening, when the speaker was Mrs. E. Kyle Simpson, principal of the Changtu Normal School, West China, an institution under the joint supervision of the American Baptist, U. S. Methodist Episcopal, Canadian Methodist and the Friends' Mission of England. Her subject was the education of native Chinese girls as teachers in the girls' schools of China.

China.

Only Five.

"There are but five of such normal schools in China, and there is need of very many more in a country where the population is 400,000,000," said the speaker. "This educational work among the women and girls was made possible by the funds supplied by the W. M. S. Of course these schools are for girls only, as co-education is a thing not to be thought of in China. It is the girls who need help towards education as there are plenty of teachers for boys in China. And in the establishing of such normal schools as that at Changtu, a good work is being done, for there teachers of girls are being trained. **REBELLION OF 1837** 

"These schools are purely Chinese schools in that the teaching goes on in the native language and native customs are preserved, but the course, which lasts for two years, is based on western educational ideas. At the present there is no higher education in China. These are the pioneer days of Chinese education, and every effort is being put forward to see that the masses of the people receive an elementary education. The institution of normal schools took place only in 1910, and five more have been added since that time," concluded the speaker.

Another speaker of the evening was Mrs. Tennant, whose subject was Purely Chinese from the papers of Rev. William Proud-Mrs. Tennant, whose subject was Christian Stewardship." Mrs. John
