Application to Parliament

Notice is hereby given that an appli-
cation will be made to the Legislative
Assembly of the Province of Ontario,
at the next session thereof, on behalf
of the City Gas Company of London,
for a special Act for the following pur-
poses:

1. To amend the Statute of 6 Edward
VII, Chap. 123, passed on the 1st day
of May, 1905, entitled an Act respecting
the City Gas Company of London, by
repealing and striking out Section 7 of
the said Act and substituting therefor
the following: "The said Company shall
from and after the passing of this Act
be authorized and empowered to charge
for gas supplied to consumers within the
limits of the City of London, as now
extended or hereafter extended, at one
dollar and forty cents per thousand
cubic feet of gas, whether used for
heating purposes or otherwise, that is
to say, the Company may charge one
dollar and seventy cents for each
thousand feet of gas, subject, however,
to a discount of thirty cents per thou-
sand cubic feet, to which the customer
will be entitled if the amount due by
such customer be paid within twenty
days after the same becomes due, and
shall continue thereafter to sell gas to
such consumers at a rate not greater
than the said rate."

2. To amend Section 12 of the said Act,
by striking out the figures "340,000" in
the fifth line thereof and substituting
"1,000,000," and also to amend Section 9
of the said Act by striking out the
figures "\$250,000" in the fourth line there-
of and substituting the figure "\$500,000."
The effect of which amendments will
be to make it lawful for the Company
to increase its authorized capital stock
to \$600,000, and its borrowings on de-
bentures or bonds by \$250,000.

The reason for requiring the said
amendments is, that the cost of material
and labor has increased to such an ex-
tent that the figures mentioned are
necessary to enable the said Company
to remain in business and supply gas
to its customers, and the said Company
required further capital to carry on the
said business.
