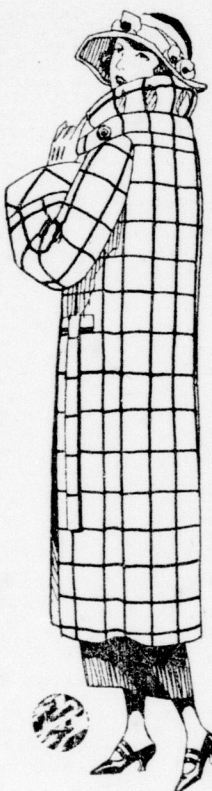

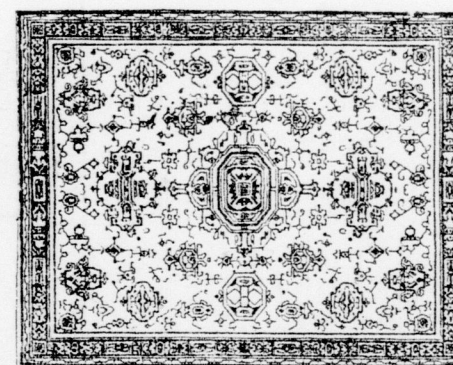

**CHOIR CONCERT
AT COLLEGIATE
BRILLIANT EVENT**Cronyn Memorial Singers Ren-
der Delightful Program
Last Night.

AUDITORIUM CROWDED

Having a rainy evening against
them and other attractions prevail-
ing, the choir of Cronyn Memorial
Church, with their annual concert
last night, scored a triumph before
a note was sounded. Their promise
of a program so tempting filled the
collegiate auditorium to the extent
that there were only a few empty
seats in the rear, and the artists and
choir had that comfortable assur-
ance as they came to the platform of
a sea of faces, quite without those
ominous spaces which bespeak a lack
of interest. This assurance and the
measure of confidence in their own
talent and training enabled them to
be at their best.The choir invited to London as
their assisting artists Alfred Heather,
the English tenor, and Claude Biggs,
pianist. With these, and its own
program of madrigals and glees, the
concert was one of a steady excel-
lence, featured brilliantly here and
there with numbers of particular
beauty. Among such were the
"Annie Laurie" and "Bring To Me
Only With Thine Eyes" by the male
section of the choir, surely two of
the most delightfully rendered num-
bers which ever charmed an audi-
ence. These two were sung as part
songs with an exquisite blending of
voices, a manifest credit to the men
themselves, and to Clarence Gil-
mour, under whom they are directed.The precision and harmony of the
choir voices, singing each number
with no accompaniment other than
that of Mr. Gilmour's baton, was at
once the brilliant feature of the
concert. The selections chosen were
numbers not commonly heard, and,
as such, were all the more insistent
in their pleasure. Old works they
were, for the most part dating back
for centuries, and of a quaint beauty
and charm which fascinated the
audience. Among them were "Sing,
and We Chant It" (Thomas Morley,
1534); "Shoot, False Love, I Care
Not" (R. L. De Pearsall, 1795-1856);
"O Can Ye Sew Cushions?" (an old
Scottish cradle song, to a setting by
Granville Bantock); "Celtic Hymn"
(from a work in the nineteenth cen-
tury, and "As the Moon's Soft Splen-
dor, a setting by Charles Wood, to
the Shelley poem, with two beauti-
fully rendered numbers by women's
voices.Mr. Biggs' opening contribution to
the program was a series of Bach
numbers, which left his audience
with no doubt of the clear beauty of
his playing. A lovely mellowness
ran through the opening numbers,
seemingly to shade the brilliancy of
the technique, so that only when the
spell of the theme had faded did the
mind realize that here was the play-
ing of a master. The Schubert-
Liszt "Erkling" and Chopin num-
bers were among his other selections.The rich tenor voice displayed
with Mr. Heather's opening song was
all that was necessary to crown the
evening. He sang first "I Attempt
From Love's Sickness to Fly," "The
Indian Queen" (Purcell), including
also the first group "Rendit Sereno
al Ciglio (Handel), and "Adelaide"
(Beethoven).With the audience, Mr. Heather
seemed to give precedence to his two
sacred numbers, works of Hugo Wolf,
"Come Mary, Take Comfort," and
"An Old Picture." Both are built on
the theme of Mary and the Christ
Child, the former depicting the weary
journey to Jerusalem, with the piano
accompaniment built in such a way
that it suggests the tired figures and
the donkey limping with them into
Bethlehem. "An Old Picture" was
inspired by a painting of Mary with
the baby Jesus at her knee, and in
the background, the cross glowing
faintly.Mr. Heather's concluding group,
English, Irish and Scotch folk songs,
were of a ready appeal.**WARREN GOVERNMENT
DEFEATED IN HOUSE**Non-Confidence Vote Follows
Statement by Premier of
Newfoundland.

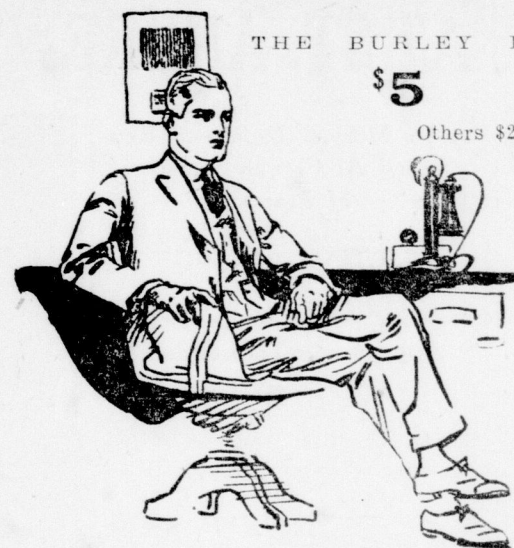
St. Johns, Nfld., April 24.—The
whole fabric of the Warren govern-
ment came tumbling down this af-
ternoon immediately after the open-
ing of the local assembly. Members
of the lower house had just returned
from the legislative council chambers
when Premier Warren rose in his
place in the House and stated that
he had but seventeen men out of a
total membership of 36 on his side.
Immediately Richard Crammy moved
a resolution of non-confidence in the
government. The motion was sup-
ported by the opposition, who were
there in force except for C. E. Hunt,
who is absent from the country. In
addition it was voted for by Sir
Richard Squires, Captain J. Jones,
A. M. Colpin and Ernest Simmons,
who broke from the ranks of the
government. The motion carried by a
majority of one, with Harvey Hall,
of the government, for, not pres-
ent, and A. W. Pickett, minister of
public works, sick in the hospital. The
ayes polled sixteen votes and the
nays fifteen.It is understood that Premier War-
ren will wait on the governor at
once and ask for a dissolution and
the issuance of writs for a general
election.TO HOLD SOUTH WATERLOO
