WARDENS FAVOR CHANGE OF TYPES

Administration of Ontario
Highways Attacked at
Toronto Meeting.

IMPROVE RURAL LIFE

Canadian Press Despatch.

Toronto, Oct. 16.—Matters concerning the administration of Ontario's road system were given broad discussion today at the parliament buildings when county wardens from all parts of the province met in conference with government officials. The meeting was called in connection with the work of the advisory highway committee.

The most important suggestion which crystallized from the day's discussion was that the present scheme of road classification should be changed, and that in place of township, two types of county and provincial highways, there should be only one type each of township, county and provincial road. Under the present system the government recognizes two types of county roads and gives a 40 per cent subsidy to the one and a 60 per cent subsidy to the other. The feeling of today's gathering was that only one type of county road should be recognized, and that a subsidy of at least 50 per cent and possibly even 60 per cent should be granted it. At present the government gives an 80 per cent subsidy to provincial roads and a 30 per cent subsidy to township roads.

WATCHMAN CLEAR OF DEATH BLAME

Jury Finds Towerman Guiltless, Though Crossing Gates Were Up.

While finding that the crossing gates were up, the jury investigating the death of Wesley L. Standfield at the Rectory street level crossing on October 7 completely exonerated the towerman and train crew, but recommended that improvements be made in the handling of the gates and signals at the crossing.

The verdict of the jury was: "Wesley L. Standfield came to his death on October 7 by being struck by engine 2547 of the C. N. R. at the Rectory street crossing while the gates at the crossing were up. We are of the opinion that the system of signals at this point is defective, and that the man in charge is handicapped. There are five levers to control in this tower, one covers the movements of the street railway, another the railway traffic going east and west, and others control the crossing gates. We believe that this is altogether too much for one man to handle with safety."

Out 30 Minutes.

It required just 30 minutes for the jury to decide upon the verdict after hearing the testimony of a number of witnesses.

The inquest was in charge of Coroner Robert Ferguson, and Crown Attorney Albert Judd questioned the witnesses. D. F. McCarroll of Toronto represented the C. N. R. Detective Harry Down represented the police department.

The first witness called was Engineer W. Bayliffe, who was in the cab of the engine when the accident occurred. He said that the engine bell was ringing and that the semaphore on the track was "ok." The engine was going five or six miles an hour, and it was stopped in 12 feet after he heard the crash.

He noticed that the gates were down five or six minutes after the crash, but did not notice whether they were down when the engine started to cross the crossing. His evidence was corroborated by his fireman, Alfred Cornish, 424 Rectory street.

George Hayden, 383 Adelaide street, towerman at the Rectory street crossing, was next called. He said that the crash was the first thing that attracted his attention. As soon as he saw something had happened he dropped the gates. He had lifted the gates to allow a car that was standing on the north side to cross. Suddenly the engine came
