Following the failure of the Windsor City Council at its meeting on Monday night to adopt the report of the fire committee, which asked authority to call for tenders for alterations to the main fire hall estimated to cost \$5,000, Alderman Thomas Eansor, chairman of the committee, tendered his resignation to the council, but they declined to accept it. Later when several councillors in an ante room endeavored to reconcile the offending members, Ald. Eansor refused to be reconciled and declared the council's action showed them to be "a lot of welters." City Solicitor Davis, who was present at the meeting, ruled that as the money for the repairs to the hall had not been placed in the estimates, the council would be acting illegally in authorizing the expenditure.
