NO SPRING SLASH BURNING NOW

Except Under Personal Supervision of the Fire Warden or Ranger.

One of the most important steps taken in New Brunswick towards greater protection of the forests has been the policy of encouraging fall brush burning and the discouragement of spring burning of slash, piles and debris.

During the period from April 15th until October 15th burning within half a mile of forest land is not allowed, except under permit together with the personal supervision of the ranger or fire warden acting under his supervision, while after May 24th it is strictly prohibited and no fire permits may be issued, unless special authority is secured from the Deputy Minister of Lands and Mines.

Regulations governing the burning of slash are contained in a handy booklet, which is printed in both English and French, and may be obtained for the asking from the Department of Lands and Mines, Fredericton. That the Fall Brush Burning has the endorsement of the public has been made very evident by the resolutions passed by municipal councils and other bodies and it is hoped that the increased precaution being taken by the settlers will prevent Forest Fires this spring.

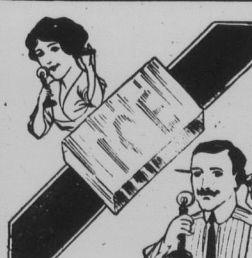
