A London cable to-day says: Canadian Pacific has again advanced sharply and is now

to still higher quotations.

The official discount rate of the Bank of England is unchanged at 2½ per cent.

Owing to the action of the Dominion Govera-ment in refusing to accede to the request of the Ontario millers to either increase the duty on flour, ordecrease the duty on wheat, there is a flour, or decrease the duty on wheat, there is a concerted action now amongst millers to break the price of wheat. Manifoba No. 1 hard was wanted at the same price, but sollers held at \$1.20. One car of hard wheat effered by sample, with \$1.12 bid.
