#### Public School Grants.

Circulars, outlining the plan on which the Legislature's grants to rural Public and Separate schools will be distributed, will be sent by the Department of Education in a few days to inspectors and trustees throughout the province. The first instalments of the amounts voted are payable on August 1st. The sums due to the various school districts will be apportioned on the basis of the salaries paid to teachers, the grade and professional certificates of the teachers, the value of the equipment, the character of the accommodation of the schools, and the assessment of the schools and the assessment of the schools are mountine excess of the grants of last year. In the districts \$85,000 will be distributed. In addition to the aid given for the purpose of encouraging the payment of adequate salaries to teachers, special grants will be made on the basis of the qualifications of the teachers. This will amount in organized districts to 20 in each case where the teachers hold a professional cations of the teachers. In its minimum in organized districts to \$20 in each case where the teachers hold a professional first or second class certificate. In unorganized districts this grant will be \$20 where the instructor is the holder of a third class certificate, \$25 in the case of a second-class certificate, and \$35 where second-class certificate, and \$35 where the teacher has a first-class certificate. Provision is made for special grants to assist Public and Separate schools, and regulations are drawn up for the distribution of the \$5,000 for rural school

#### Ekfrid Note Cases

Glencoe, May 27.—Judge Elliott has handed down his decision in the matter handed down his decision in the matter of the Standard Bank versus eleven farmers of the township of Ekfrid for payment of notes of \$120 each, and which the farmers refused to pay, alleging misrepresentation. The notes, it will be remembered, were obtained by the Farmers' Supply Co., a concern that offered to supply its members with goods cheaper than it was possible to buy them locally. After securing the notes, the Farmers' Supply Company turned them over to the Standard Bank as collateral for money loaned the Supply Co. When the money loaned the Supply Co. When the notes became due a number of farmers paid them, but eleven of them refused to paid them, but eleven of them retused to do so, hence the suit. Judge Elliott gave judgment non-suiting all of the cases on technicalities. The matter occasioned widespread interest on account of the number of farmers interested, and the decision meets with the approval of the farming community.
