The Maritime Home for Girls

The name of this Institution is "The Maritime Home for Girls." The object is to provide a Home and Training School for homeless and wayward girls, and girls who are being reared among vicious and degrading surroundings. Such girls may be admitted at from seven to sixteen years of age, and continued in residence for such time as may seem to be necessary. However, each inmate will be returned to her former home, or placed in a foster home, as soon as satisfactory evidence is given that this can be done with safety to both the girl and the community. Probationary oversight will be given these girls after they have left the Home, until they reach the age of twenty-one years.

All girls to be received into the Home must be committed, either after due trial, or formally, by a Magistrate. Girls who have begun a life of wrong-doing, upon conviction by the presiding Magistrate, or girls between seven and sixteen years of age, who may be living in homes of vice and filth, upon being brought before the Courts by the officers of the Children's Aid Society, may be committed to the Home. White primarily intended to be a home for Protestant girls, neither religion, color, nor race, shall be a bar to entrance.

It is not the intention that girls and women who have become inmates of houses of ill-fame, or who may be known to be prostitutes, shall be committed to this Home. These will find a welcome, care and help in the Presbyterian Home now being carried on in Sydney, N. S., or in the Methodist Home shortly to be opened in St. John, N. B.

The Parliament of Canada enacted (Chap. 39, 2-4 George V.) an addition to the Prisons and Reformatories Act (R. S. Ch. 148), entitled Part IX, which makes provision for the committal by Magistrates in Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island, to the Maritime Home for Girls, at Halifax, of any girl under 16 years of age, for any offence against the laws of Canada. The session of 1914 amended this law, naming Truro, N. B., as the place where the Home is located. This Act has been brought into effect, as required by its own provisions, by proclamation on 1st September, 1914.

Correspondence is now proceeding with the Governments of Canada, and of Newfoundland, to secure the necessary legislation to enable the Home to be available for reception of Newfoundland girls who may be committed to residence there.

The Maritime Home for Girls is intended to serve Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland. It is owned jointly by the Board of Home Missions and Social Service of the Presbyterian Church, and by the Department of Social Service and Evangelism of the Methodist Church. It is under the supervision and management of a joint Board, one half the members being appointed by each of the Boards already named, and includes representatives of the Anglican, Baptist, Methodist and Presbyterian Churches.

The Maritime Home for Girls is financed as follows:—
The cost of property, buildings, furnishings, etc., shall be met by contributions secured in the Maritime Provinces and Newfoundland.
The maintenance shall be met: By per capita grant, per inmate, as provided by legislation in each Province.
By proceeds of the farm, garden, orchard, hennery, laundry, etc., as may be developed in the Home.
By such grants for teaching the school as may be arranged with the authorities.
By such further amount as may be necessary to meet maintenance expenses as shall be raised and contributed by the Departments already named in the two churches co-operating in this matter.

The new buildings for the Maritime Home for Girls are to be erected on the cottage system of residences. Sufficient land has been secured to insure outdoor occupation and recreation. Provision is made for ample water supply, sewerage, and electric light. The property secured is most admirably situated for all the purposes of the Home. It is within reasonable distance of an excellent market for the products of the garden, orchard, etc. The soil is most suitable for cultivation of that character.

The Education shall be under the supervision of the Board of Governors. It shall include the ordinary branches of the Public School, and also Household Science, including cooking, sewing, housekeeping, etc., together with such branches of Industrial Education as may, from time to time, be considered advisable or necessary. The purpose is to train the residents so they may support themselves, and surrounding them with the very best Christian influences, and so develop to be useful members of society, and worthy citizens.
