

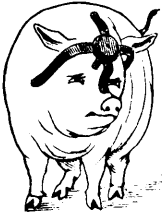

roasting process, keep a basin of water in the

wheat plentifully and faithfully. Never put

placed in a deep can or vessel, keeping the
handles above the water, lukewarm until
washed clean, then thoroughly dried.

To remove fruit stains, let the spotted part
