

wounded and handicapped in Sarajevo and other centres in Bosnia-Herzegovina; and

- \$500 000 to the Special United Nations Fund for the restoration of essential services in Sarajevo.

The Minister also noted that Canada is among the four main participants in the ongoing humanitarian airlift into Sarajevo in co-operation with the UN High Commissioner for Refugees. Canadian aircraft have conducted nearly 1500 flights, transporting more than 10 000 passengers and 20 000 metric tonnes of food and relief supplies.

Mr. Ouellet made the announcement today in a statement to the House of Commons.

This contribution brings Canada's total humanitarian assistance to the former Yugoslavia, since fall 1991, to approximately \$60 million. Funding for this contribution was provided in the February 1994 federal budget and is therefore built into the existing fiscal framework.
