- 4. It is not the policy of the Canadian Wheat Board to divulge information in respect of its sales contracts for the current crop year.

### DOMICILIARY CARE PATIENTS IN D.V.A. HOSPITALS

### Question No. 562-Mr. Harley:

What percentage of the total of the patients in the various D.V.A. hospitals across Canada have been hospitalized and considered to be "domiciliary care" cases for the years 1964 and 1965?

Hon. Roger Teillet (Minister of Veterans Affairs): In 1964, domiciliary care cases constituted 41.4 per cent of the total patients in D.V.A. hospitals. In 1965, they constituted 41.9 per cent.

# D.V.A. HOSPITAL PATIENTS NOT REQUIRING ACTIVE TREATMENT

### Question No. 563-Mr. Harley:

What proportion of patients in D.V.A. hospitals at the present time could be treated in other than active-treatment hospitals?

Hon. Roger Teillet (Minister of Veterans Affairs): Of all the patients in D.V.A. hospitals at mid December, 1965, the most recent date for which statistics are available, 57.2 per cent could have been tretaed in other than active treatment hospitals.

#### \*TOLL INCREASE, ST. LAWRENCE SEAWAY

#### Question No. 569-Mr. Macaluso:

Is it the intention of the government to request the government of the United States to agree to an increase in tolls on the St. Lawrence seaway from 40 cents to 45 cents per net ton on bulk cargo and from 90 cents to \$1.00 per net ton on general cargo?

Mr. J. A. Byrne (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Transport): The June 30, 1964, international agreement requires that the St. Lawrence Seaway Authority and the St. Lawrence Seaway Development Corporation shall report to their respective governments as to the sufficiency of the authorized tolls, not later than July 1, 1966.

The Authority is reviewing these tolls with the Corporation at the present time, after which it will report to the government.

## PAYMENTS BY EMERGENCY MEASURES ORGANIZATION

#### Question No. 570-Mr. Saltsman:

- 1. What amount has been paid by the Emergency Measures Organization to the various provinces during the fiscal year 1964-1965?
- 2. What individual amounts have been paid by E.M.O. to the counties and cities in Ontario during the fiscal year 1964-1965?
- Hon. C. M. Drury (Minister of Industry): 1. Under grants to provinces and municipalities for civil defence and related purposes, a total of \$4,927,236 was paid by the Canada Emergency Measures Organization to provinces as follows: Yukon, \$147; Nfld., \$47,651; P.E.I., \$16,687; N.S., \$218,021; N.B., \$135,112; Que., \$1,469,185; Ont., \$1,556,228; Man., \$222,825; Sask., \$167,055; Alta., \$517,599; B.C., \$576,726.
- 2. Under civil defence financial assistance program, no individual amounts were paid to counties and municipalities by the Canada Emergency Measures Organization; however, included in the payment of \$1,556,228 to Ontario, an amount of \$1,180,942 was included for distribution by the province to its counties and municipalities.

#### HYDROGRAPHIC SURVEY, LAKE WINNIPEG

#### Question No. 574-Mr. Stefanson:

Was a survey carried out on lake Winnipeg, Manitoba, from 1957 to 1962 by the Canadian hydrographic service, and if so (a) will this survey be re-established (b) when will work commence, and (c) what is the expected completion date?

Hon. Jean-Luc Pepin (Minister of Mines and Technical Surveys): 1. Yes. (a) The service plans to re-establish the lake Winnipeg survey in 1967 if there are sufficient trained survey staff available. (b) Answered by (a). (c) It is estimated that, by the use of modern techniques, the completion of the survey of the lake will require at least four seasons' work.

#### Question No. 584-Mr. Bell (Carleton):

- 1. What (a) quantity (b) dollar value, of cheese was imported into Canada from the United States in each of the years 1962, 1963, 1964 and 1965?
- 2. What (a) quantity (b) dollar value, of cheese was exported to the United States in each of the years 1962, 1963, 1964 and 1965?
- 3. Is there an import quota on Canadian cheese imposed by the United States?
  - 4. If so, what is its nature?
