#### REGIONAL PSYCHIATRIC CENTRE, KINGSTON

#### Question No. 3,932—Mr. Lawrence:

What is the name of the present (a) Director (b) Deputy Director of the Regional Psychiatric Centre, Kingston and, in each case (a) for how long has he/she held the position (b) what position did he/she hold previously (c) what is his/her salary level (d) what formal education does he/she have?

**Hon. Bob Kaplan (Solicitor General of Canada):** In so far as the Correctional Service of Canada is concerned:

A. The Medical Director at the Regional Psychiatric Centre, Kingston is Dr. Frederick Peter Stephens. (a) Date of appointment to present position: February 9, 1981. \*(b) Position held prior to present appointment: Clinical Director at the Regional Psychiatric Centre, Kingston, Ontario. (c) Salary range: \$52,192 to \$63,152. \*(d) This position requires graduation from a recognized school of medicine and certification in a medical specialty recognized in Canada by a statutory licensing body.

B. There is no Deputy Director at the Regional Psychiatric Centre, Kingston but the Clinical Director, Dr. Andrew Maley, is presently designated by the Medical Director to act in his absence through a Commissioner's Directive issued in accordance with Section 29(3) of the Penitentiary Act.

(a) Date of appointment as Clinical Director: March 2, 1981. \*(b) Position held prior to present appointment: Clinical Psychiatrist at the Regional Psychiatric Centre, Kingston. (c) Salary range: \$52,192 to \$63,152. \*(d) The minimum educational qualifications for psychiatrists working in the Correctional Service of Canada require graduation from a recognized school of medicine and certification in a medical specialty recognized in Canada by a statutory licensing body.

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#### RADIO ADVERTISING IN QUEBEC

#### Question No. 4,553—Mr. Gamble:

With reference to the answer to question No. 4,395 which stated in part "There was no preferential treatment in as much as English (and French) radio was utilized in Quebec (and in no other province) to offset the lack of billboard advertising as outlined in Part 2 above" (a) what was the total radio time on (i) English-language (ii) French-language radio in Quebec which was employed to offset the billboard advertising availability (b) how does the use of French radio broadcasting in the Province of Quebec offset the lack of English-language billboard advertising in the Province of Quebec?

**Hon. Lloyd Axworthy (Minister of Employment and Immigration):** (a) (i) English-language—\$32,158.00\*; (ii) French-language—\$120,169.00\*\*.

(b) French-language radio was never intended to offset the lack of English-language billboard advertising in Quebec. English radio was used to offset the lack of English billboards. French radio was used to offset the lack of French billboards.

(a) (i)\* English radio time over a 3-week period: Each of six stations: 79 30-second spots.

(ii)\*\* French radio time over a 3-week period: Each of 29 stations: 79 30-second spots; each of 66 stations: 42-44 30-second spots; each of 19 stations: 32-34 30-second spots.

#### TRIP TO FAR EAST OF DOMINION FIRE COMMISSIONER

#### Question No. 4,562—Mr. MacKay:

1. Did the Dominion Fire Commissioner, Mr. G.A. Hope, recently take a trip to the Far East and, if so (a) what was the purpose and duration (b) what were the destinations (c) who accompanied the Commissioner (d) what was the total cost to the Government?

2. How many years of service has the Commissioner left to serve before his normal retirement age?

3. Are there any plans to appoint the Commissioner, on an acting basis or otherwise, to the job of head of the Western Region of the Dominion Fire Commissioner's Office, located in Vancouver?

**Hon. Roméo LeBlanc (Minister of Public Works):** 1. Yes. (a) As a member of a fire protection delegation sponsored by the Canadian Association of Fire Chiefs (CAFC) under External Affairs Scientific and Technical Exchange Program. The Commissioner was out of the country for 15 days (October 23 to November 7 inclusive).

(b) The destinations were Beijing (Peking); Tianjin; Shanghai; Guangzhou (Canton); and Hong Kong.

(c) (i) Bernard Bonser, Chief of the Toronto Fire Department and President of the CAFC; (ii) Percy Clark, Chief of the Saint John, N.B. Fire Department and immediate past president of the CAFC; (iii) John Bateman, Ontario Fire Marshal and President of the Association of Canadian Fire Marshals and Fire Commissioners (ACFM&FC); (iv) Donald Baird, Director of Fire Underwriters' Survey under the Insurer's Advisory Organization; (v) Murdoch Galbreath, Architect, Senior Research Officer in the Division of Building Research (Fire Research Section) of the National Research Council of Canada; and (vi) Lorne MacLean, Lt. Col., Fire Marshal of the Canadian Forces.

(d) The total cost to Public Works Canada was \$4,000 made payable to the Canadian Association of Fire Chiefs Inc., which includes the Department's share in financing a reciprocal visit by a delegate from the People's Republic of China to Canada.

2. Seven years plus.

3. The position referred to is not available; however should it become vacant, normal staffing procedures will apply.
