Dear Mr. May:-

I was very much interested in receiving your letter of the 10th instant. So far as sending a McGill Team to England is concerned the proposal is off for this year.

I think you are quite right in sending your invitation to the National Federation of Canadian University Students and I have no doubt that they will be able to get together a satisfactory team.

We are quite aware of the financial difficulties in England and had no idea whatever of asking any assistance either from you or from the Universities. In any case it is not at all likely that there would be more than a very few debates so that it would be impossible for receipts to cover the outlay.

You will understand that while I should be very glad to see a team arranged by the Federation, I am more interested in seeing a McGill Team travelling in the same way as do those from Oxford and Cambridge and this is what I trust will be possible and what our representatives will arrange if practicable. I thank you very much for your interest and shall certainly let your Union know what is decided.
