## BILL R<sup>14</sup>.

## An Act for the relief of Geraldine Isabella Johnson Mole.

Preamble,

WHEREAS Geraldine Isabella Johnson Mole, residing at the town of Laval West, in the province of Quebec, wife of Thomas Mole, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Montreal, in the said province, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the first day of 5 July, A.D. 1949, at the said city, she then being Geraldine Isabella Johnson, a spinster; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, because of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is 10 expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved. 1. The said marriage between Geraldine Isabella Johnson 15 and Thomas Mole, her husband, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again. 2. The said Geraldine Isabella Johnson may at any time hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully marry 20 if the said marriage with the said Thomas Mole had not been solemnized.
