The sole head of a family, or any male The sole nead of a lamily, or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency) on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of

at least eighty acres, on certain condi-tions. A habitable house is required, ex-cept where residence is performed in the cept where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homestead the process of standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also fifty acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions,
