U. of P. Runners Win 2 Out of 3 Relays

Interesting College Team Races at Philadelphia-McGill Drops Out.

PHILADELPHIA, April 27.—The University of Pennsylvania won two of the three bive ribbon events at the annual relay races nere this afternoon, and Syracuse University took the other one. The two and four-mile relay championships of America were captured by the Philadelphia institution after a hard struggle, and the one-mile national championship was won by Syracuse after Reidpain, her fast quarter-miler, had extended himself to the limit to beat out Sanders of Ill nois, Some of the best quarter-mile men in college were in this event. Both of Pennsylvania's victories were also hard won, her runners having to extend themselves right up to the tape.

A hard rain fell during the afternoon, and the track in many places was half an inch deep with water.

McGill University scratched its team in the mile.

While the west did not fare very well in the relay races, the athletes from over the Alleghanys showed up well in the lield events and hurdles. In the 100-yard hurdle race, Nicholson of Missouri won in the good time of 144-5 seconds, considering the condition of the track.

A feature of the afternoon was the performance of Al Gutterson of Vermont University, who won the broad jump by leaping 4 feet % inch from a muddy take-off. It is probable that he will be a strong contender for a place on the American Olympic team.
